May all of you have a very Merry and Joyous Christmas, and a healthy new year filled with the light that only Jesus can give!!! God Bless! Father Ray



On February 22, 1900, one thousand one hundred Knights were initiated into the newly established Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus. Fast forward one hundred and twenty five years later: February 22, 2025, the Supreme Council and Supreme Master John McCuster are anticipating to replicate the event on this milestone anniversary. The Fourth Degree 125th Anniversary Celebration will be held in New York with Mass at St Patrick's Cathedral, a premiere of the new Fourth Degree Exemplification which will now be open for all to witness, and a banquet at the Hilton Mid-Town.
