

Travis Adkins was born on December 9, 1975 in Great Falls, Montana to Jack and Elaine Adkins - a faithful Catholic couple. When Travis was 6, the family moved to Bozeman, Montana. Travis loved the outdoors, especially fishing, hunting, camping and snowmobiling with his father.

Travis went to school at Bozeman HS and Kemper Military Academy. After graduation, he worked as a Contractor, painting, pouring concrete, and repairing small engines. In 1996 Travis had a son, who he named Trevor.

But Travis became restless and discontent with civilian life and felt called to the Military. His father, Jack, had served in the Army for 4 years in Vietnam during the early stages of the War. In November 2000 at 24-years old, Travis enlisted in the Army. He was deployed to Kuwait with the 101^{st} Airborne Division in March 2003 and was an Infantry Fire Team Leader during the invasion of Iraq a month later.

At the end of his enlistment, he wanted to transfer to the 501st Airborne Infantry Division at Fort Richardson, Alaska. There were no slots, so Travis left the Army and came home. He enrolled at the University of Montana at Missoula and worked as a painting and concrete contractor.

But civilian life wasn't for Travis. In 2005, he re-enlisted and was assigned to the 10th Mountain Division at Fort Drum, NY. Training for his next deployment, Travis took on his job as team leader with a passion, preparing soldiers who had not yet experienced combat. He had found his niche; readying soldiers for battle.

Travis' Unit was deployed to Iraq in August 2006 for Operation Iraqi Freedom. They were assigned to an Area between the Euphrates River and Bagdad called "the Triangle of Death". Stationed near the town of Abu Sarnak, his Platoon was responsible for keeping the busy Route Caprice to Bagdad open and free of improvised explosive devices (IEDs).

Over the following months Travis' platoon drove over this route hundreds of times. Twice the truck he was riding in was destroyed by an IED blast. Fortunately, Travis survived both attacks.

Travis was known for welcoming and mentoring young soldiers on their first deployment in a war zone and helping them overcome their fears. He was unusually calm and trusted by his men to make good decisions under fire. His soldiers believed that Travis always knew what he was doing.

On June 1st, 2007, Travis called his mother and father about 2:30 AM in Montana. They had not heard from their son in weeks and were greatly relieved. He told them that his deployment was supposed to be over in two months.

Later that day Travis was in the front passenger seat of his Humvee. Michael Kistel was the driver, the platoon medical officer was in the back seat and Sand Aijo was in the machine gun turret. They were listening to radio cross talk from the other Humvees when there was a report of 2 pairs of suspicious males on the road. Adkin's Humvee sped to the scene.

When they arrived, only 2 men were still there, but they were acting erratically - very fidgety. Aijo pointed the machine gun at them to make sure they didn't move. Travis and the medic got out of the Humvee and separated the two men. Both acted belligerently. Travis tried to search one of the men. When the man resisted, Travis grabbed him in a bear hug and realized that the man was wearing a suicide vest. Travis picked him up, slammed on the ground. Then he fell on top of him, covering him with his body to shield the Medic and the other two soldiers on the truck. Despite Travis' best efforts, the man under Travis was able to detonate his suicide vest, which was filled with ball bearings and other shrapnel. Most of the blast was absorbed by Adkins body. The second man rushed the Humvee, but the Medic and turret gunner Aijo shot and killed him. A Rapid Response Team raced to the site, but there was nothing they could do for Travis.

In Bozeman, Jack and Elaine Adkins were going about their day. Elaine was home when a jeep with 2 uniformed soldiers pulled into their driveway. They asked her to call her husband to come home. Jack and Elaine could not believe their son Travis was gone.

In Minnesota, 11-year old Trevor had locked himself out of the house at lunchtime and his mother came home from work to let him in. She was about to go back to work when 2 uniformed soldiers arrived and gave them the news.

The Funeral Mass was held at Resurrection Parish in Bozeman, Montana. Father Val Zdilla said of Travis: "Human lives were saved by his heroic action - that can never be forgotten or denied". He said Atkins was someone who truly lived out his calling in life by serving in the military. "We are all safer because of his sacrifice. We remember Travis and how his life made a difference. He was this nation's son".

After the Church service, a military escort led the funeral procession to the Cemetery. Along the route hundreds of people lined the streets, waving flags and holding their hands over their hearts. Motorcyclists from the Patriot Guard Riders escorted the funeral procession. Police and Fire blocked streets as the caravan went by.

Travis Adkins cherished the time he spent with his son Trevor and included him in all of his out-door activities. At the Funeral, Trevor said: "I want him to be remembered as the best father that anyone could ask for, and also at the same time being the best soldier that anyone could ask for."

Lt. Colonel John Valledor, Adkin's Commanding Officer, knew that Travis had joined a select group of warriors who had fallen on grenades or bombs to save their fellow soldiers. Through his research he discovered that all of them had received the Medal of Honor. Colonel Valledor documented Travis Adkin's heroic actions and selfless bravery and recommended that he receive the Medal of Honor. The Army held a formal investigation, but rejected Colonel Valledor's recommendation, choosing to award Travis the Distinguished Service Cross. In August 2008, son Trevor and parents, Jack and Elaine Adkins, received the Award for Travis at Fort Drum, NY in front of his fellow soldiers and Battalion Commander Valledor.

However, ten years later in August 2018, Trevor, now 22-years old, received a phone call from the White House telling him that they would be calling back soon. A few minutes later, President Trump came on the phone to inform Trevor that a wider review of his father's heroic actions had been completed and that his father would be receiving the Medal Of Honor. Trevor said: "First he told me formally and then he talked with me for a good few minutes, personally as well".

Jack and Elaine Adkins would get the same call from President Trump in Montana a few minutes later.

The Medal of Honor is the highest military honor in the United States. It is reserved for those who have acted "conspicuously by gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of their own lives, above and beyond the call of duty. The White House ceremony was held on March 27, 2019. President Trump presented the Medal of Honor to Trevor, Jack and Elaine Adkins and Travis' sister, Jennifer. Trevor said "He was a great soldier and a great father. He was my icon".

One of the young soldiers that Travis Adkins had mentored, (now) Sgt. Jared Venable, was at the White House ceremony. He said: "What I want people to realize is that what he did was very heroic and brave, and I'm not taking anything away from that, but I want people to understand the motivation behind it. He loved us ... what he did was all that, yes, but it came from just a place of intense caring, and a sense of duty, and a sense of honor."
